Introduction

As a relative newcomer to the hobby, I probably accepted skillets quicker than some of the more established collectors. I spent many hours scanning through 14 years worth of "Observer" and a lot of contributors made it very clear that they didn't like skillets!

However, like taxation, they are here to stay and so I thought I would use my knowledge of typesetting to put all the information together.

Each set of skillets has a separate page for clarity and a full size illustration of one of the set, plus the Miss Redhead of that set at the top of the page.

The Australian-made skillets are prefixed with the letter A, the Swedish ones with an S and miscellaneous foreign-made skillets with an F. Thus AFR means Australian "Famous Redheads" and SMP is Swedish "Match Play", etc. The small box is for your convenience to keep track of your collection.

After extracting details of each new issue as is was reported in "Observer" at the time of issue, a few still slipped through the net. I would like to thank David Figg, Chris Hime, Joe Duif and the late Vera Robertson and Ron Harms for putting me right and dredging up missing skillets for me to photograph. Other people helped too, like Daphne Wiles' listing of all the "Bi-Centenary" variations in "Observer" and Pat Giroud for finding skillets for me in the "Markette".

I chose the A4 format for this catalogue as I find it easy to store as single sheets in clear copy protectors in a three-ring binder. Any alterations and additions can be easily added.

The original catalogue was produced in March 1995 in black and white, so I have reset the complete catalogue in colour to partner the Bryant & May label catalogue.

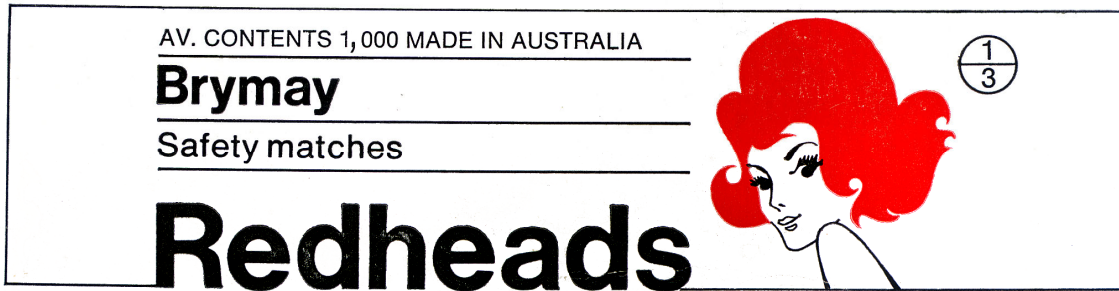

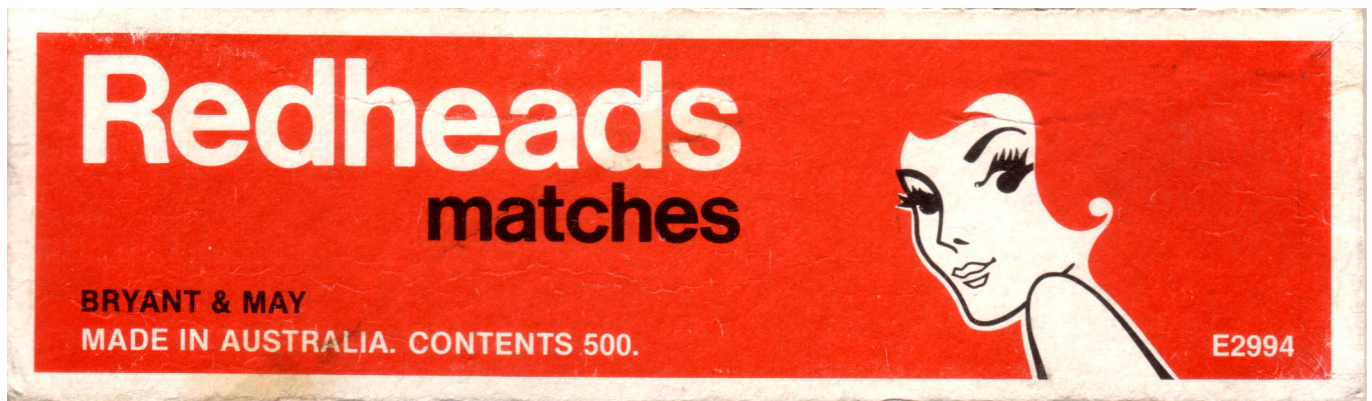

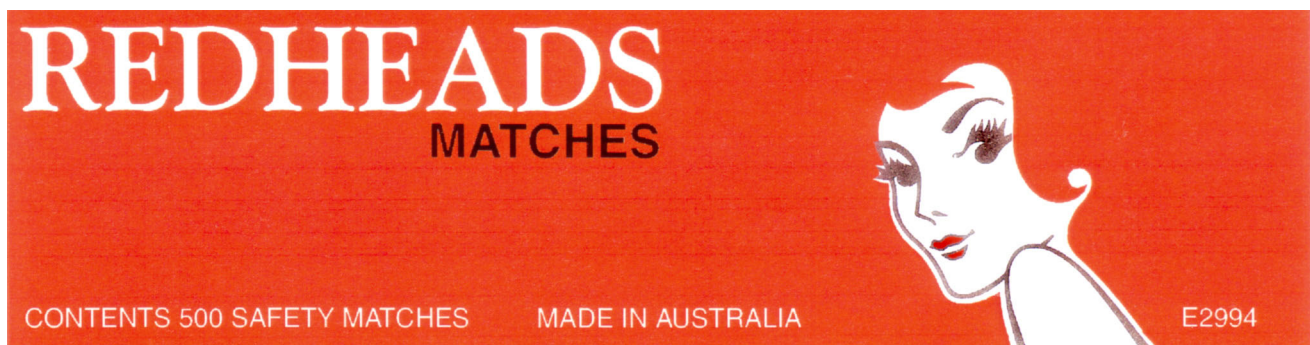

The Redheads name is now in the familiar Goudy typeface and the word "Matches" is now in capitals letters. These boxes were shipped without striker panels for safety.

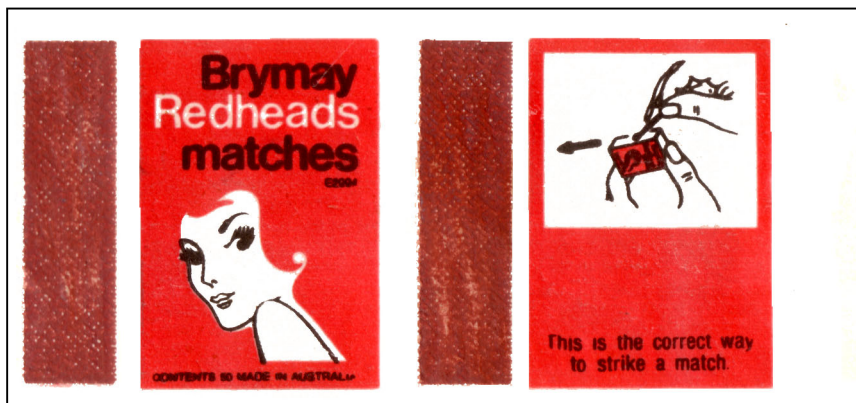

Try this Redhead Match Trick

A series of 14 numbered match tricks, first issued in 1979.

This was the first skillet set produced by B&M and had many versions.

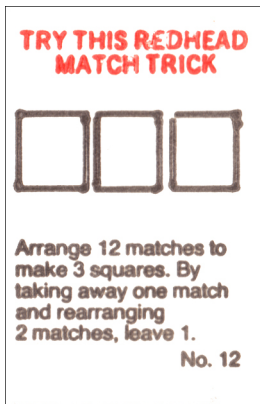
The front panel of the first six boxes carried the name "Bryant and May". The name then changed to "Bryant & May". The first 14 boxes had the words "TRY THIS REDHEAD MATCH TRICK" printed in small red letters at the top of the reverse panel. The full set was printed again with this red wording larger, but the full stop was left off the abbreviation "No". Skillets numbered 8 and 11 also

appeared with the excise number F2994. The next printing saw these mistakes corrected, then the set was printed yet again with larger contents line on the front panel

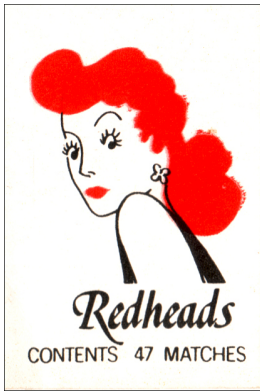

Famous Redheads - Matchtricks

A series of 40 skillets and a wrapper, the first 20 were issued in 1980. The front panels depict 12 famous redheads (*Miss Redhead, 1946; Miss Redhead, 1978; Phar Lap; Julius Caesar; Queen Elizabeth I; King Henry VIII; Vincent Van Gogh; Winston Churchill; Napoleon Bonaparte; William Shakespeare; Salome and Ginger Meggs (a popular Australian cartoon character).*)

The back panels are Match Tricks, numbered from 15 to 26 and continuing on from the 14 match tricks of the previous set.

In 1982, six more famous redheads were introduced (*Ayers Rock, Bluey Truscott; Pie and Sauce; Rod Laver; Bottlebrush and Bluey & Curly (another old Australian cartoon pair).*) Each had either of two different puzzles on the reverse, plus a different reverse for the original Queen Elizabeth I and seven different reverses for Miss Redhead, 1978.



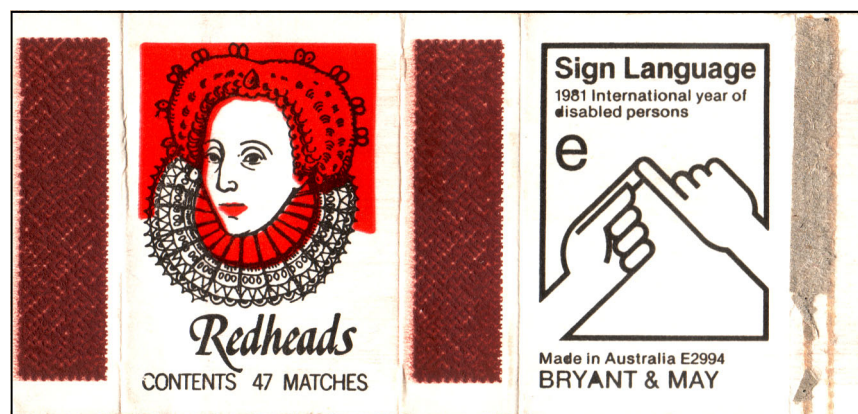
A set of 29 skillets and a wrapper, issued in 1981 to commemorate the International Year of Disabled Persons.

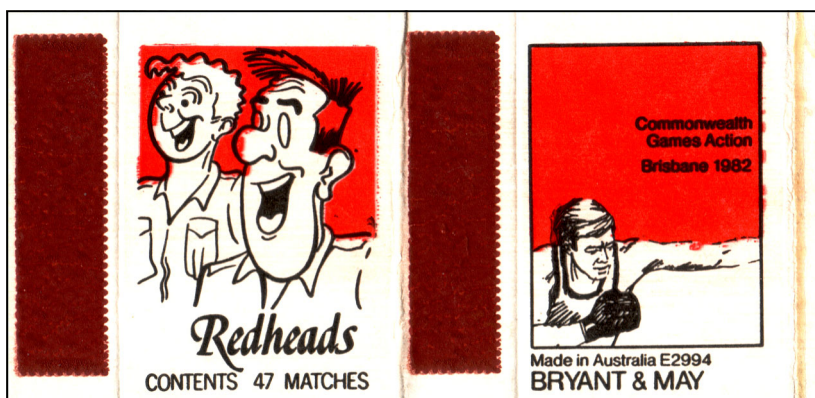

Matchbox Poker

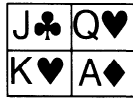
A set of skillets and wrapper, issued by Bryant & May in 1983 as a competition. The front panels represent the 13 hearts playing cards plus Miss Redhead. There are 16 different card combinations on the back panel, which, when combined with the various front panels, make a total of 31 skillets.

There were three other combinations which were the prize winners. Ace with 10, J, Q, K reverse would win \$2000; King with 9, 10, J, Q reverse to with \$50 and 10 with 4, 7, 8, 9 reverse to win a pack of cards. Winning hands were limited to 5,500 and 10,000 respectively and as the major prizes were claimed, it is probable that only the two minor prize skillets may be found in private collections.

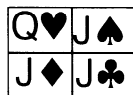

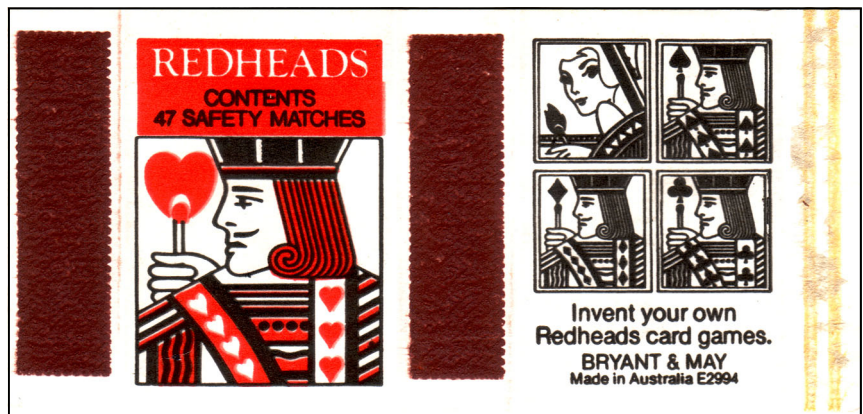

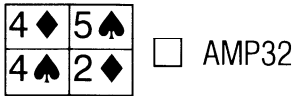
A set of skillets and wrapper, issued by Bryant & May's Western Australian Match Co. in 1983 as part of the national competition.

The front and back panels are identical and show the same four card combinations as the B&M Matchbox Poker series.

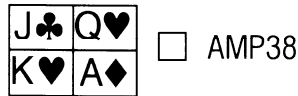
However, Matchbox Poker labels have been stuck over these skillets and can be found in four different positions; front, back and inverted on front or back.

These are not catalogued as they are stick-on labels and can be found in the B&M label catalogue, part II.

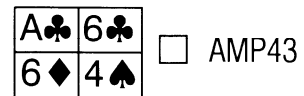

Matchbox Poker Games

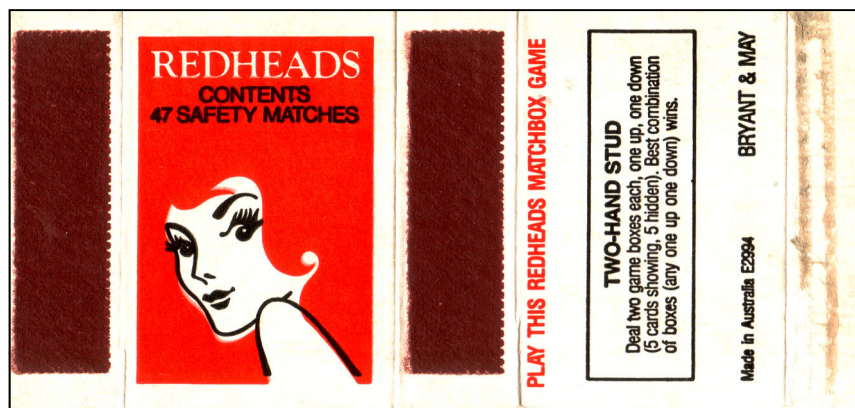
A set of five skillets issued after the Poker series in 1984.

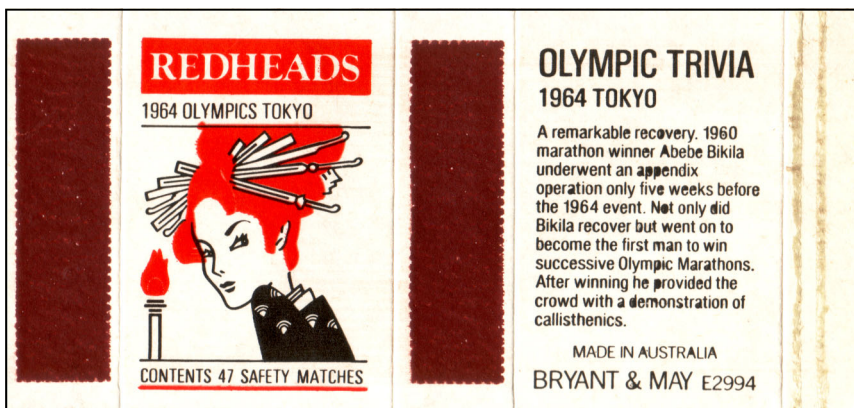
Olympic Trivia

The contents wording is similarly printed at the base of the label.

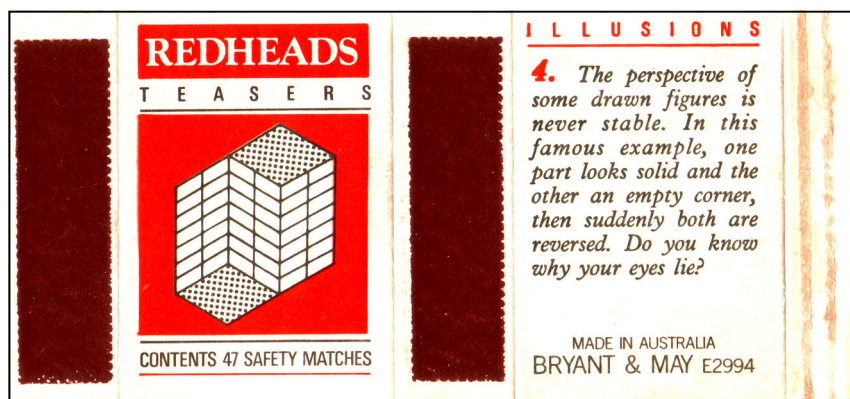
There are twelve Mazes and twelve Illusions illustrated on the front panels with the appropriate details printed on the reverse panels


How to play matchbox Dominoes
In general this game is for two players, but may be played by four, two being partners against the other two. In some of the various games any number of players from two to six may take part, each playing for himself.
A Set
A full set consists of 26 matchbox dominoes.
Drawing for the first turn
All of the boxes are turned face down on the table and thoroughly mixed up to prevent the possibility of the position on the table of any particular domino being known. Each



player should draw one box and the player having the highest double, or if no double in either hand, the box with the greatest number of dots on its face, has first set or pose. Another method is for one player to select any two boxes, and push them towards the other player face down, who chooses one. Both boxes are then turned face up and whichever gets the domino with the least number of dots has first play.
To start a game
The dominoes are then shuffled again by either or both of the players, and each then draws an equal number of pieces,

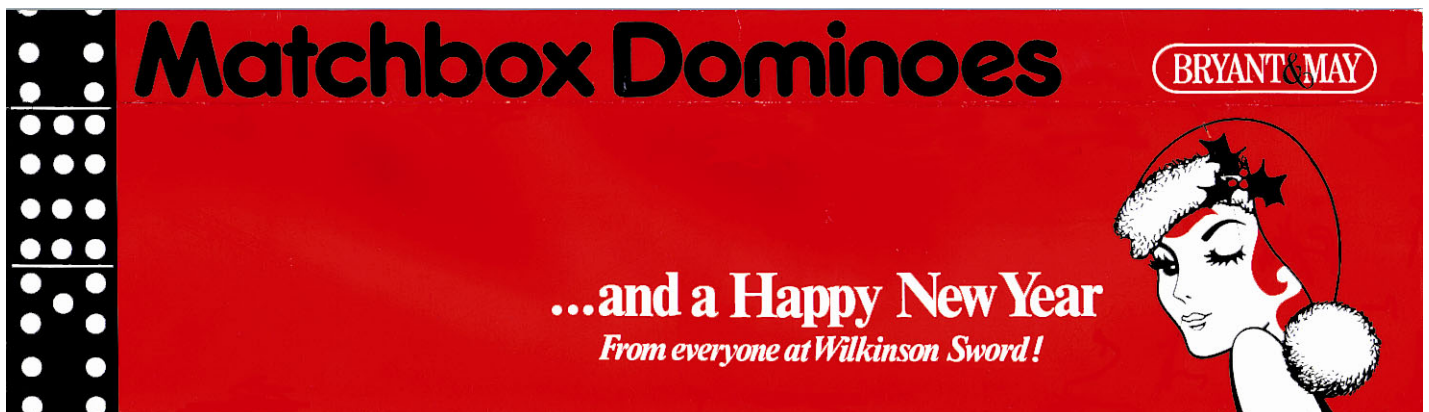


previously agreed upon. Dominoes remaining on the table are left face down and form a stock from which to draw. The players sort their boxes according to suits. The dominoes may be left standing on the table with their faces towards the players.
Principle of Dominoes
All games of dominoes are based on the principle of matching or following suit, which requires that each domino played shall belong to the same suit as that of one of the open ends of the line of dominoes previously played on the table. In playing a domino,



it must be placed so that the end of it will match and adjoin the exposed end of the line; a five being played to a five, a three to a three, and so on. Each domino played is laid face up on the table, the ends abutting, and doubles being laid crosswise or at right angles with the line. The game is finished when one of the players has no more boxes left, or if all players are unable to continue, in which case the hand is won by the one who holds the lowest number of dots and he scores not only the dots held by himself but may also add those of his adversaries. The game is won when a player has scored 100 points.

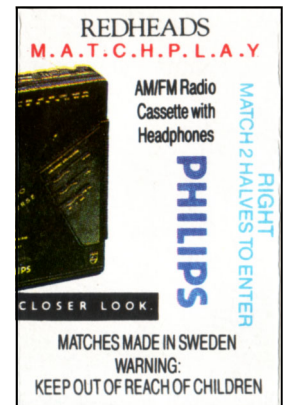

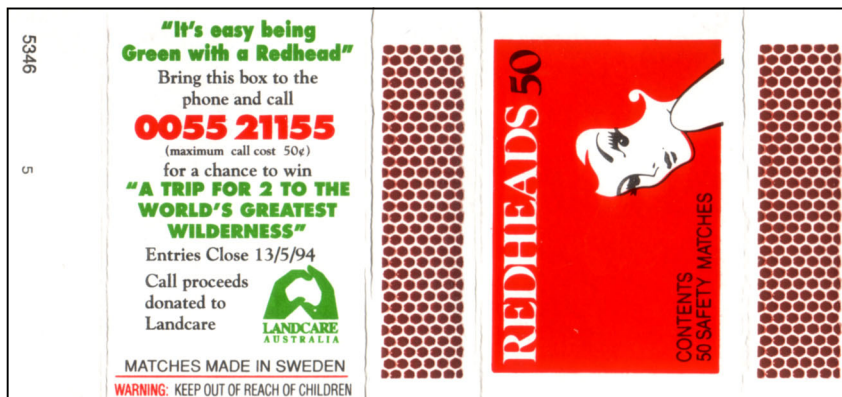

Products

A variation on the earlier Products issues. This time there are nine skillets in the set. Two of the back panels carry familiar slogans: *It's Safer with a Redhead!* with the Australian Safety Standard seal from the SSR series and *It's Easy Being Green with a Redhead!* with the "Environmentally Friendly" logo now carried on the wrappers. Big Red Safari

Winfield Cup

A series of 20 skillets issued in August, 1995, promoting The Winfield Cup and featuring all the Rugby League teams that compete for the trophy. These skillets were only issued in a special display of Winfield cigarettes. They were packaged with two matchboxes and two cigarette packets in an individual pack, selling for \$10.50 a pack. There was a different pack for each of the cigarette tar contents. A large cardboard point-of-sale set up displayed these packs, but they were very scarce and were not on sale for very long.

The front panel feature the club flag and Miss Redhead' shoulder carries the club's colours. The back panel shows the club's badge and history. The packs were only on sale in the States where Rugby League is promoted, e.g. N.S.W., Queensland, South Australia and Northern Territory. Only 15,000 sets were produced. 5000 boxes were allocated to the clubs and 2000 sets were given away as special presentation packs to employees of Rothmans.

Another new innovation is the Redhead Web site address on the front of the box.

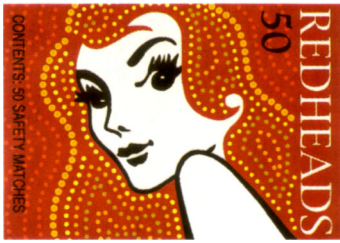
